**Slogans used to defend abortion-**

*"A fetus is not a person."*

Sounds logical, doesn't it?

That is, until you think about it. Our individual biological system begins at conception and ends at death. At all stages of this continuum we are human, as the science of genetics tells us. Our humanity does not depend on our size, stage of development or place of residence.

Unborn children in the womb can be viewed and monitored, receive blood transfusions, and even have surgery. It makes no sense to believe that they are not part of the human family.

Calling human beings "embryos" and "fetuses" serves the same purpose as calling them "adolescents" or "adults". These scientific terms indicate where a person is in her or his development. They were never meant to give the impression that the unborn child is not human. Just as the "infant" is different from the "adolescent" in terms of development and dependence, so the "fetus" is different from the "infant". Yet all are genetically human and, therefore, persons.
