The Bosco Catholic School System is looking for applicants for our morning and afternoon routes. We are also looking for people who are interested in driving for after school activities.

The combined time for the morning and afternoon school routes is about two hours including time to do inspections. The pay is \$50 per day for this. The minimum pay for school activities driving is \$12.50 per hour.

For both positions the person must hold a class CDL with an endorsement for passengers, air brakes and completed or be willing to complete the 14 hour online school bus training and then a 3 hour STOP class annually.
